Lynda completed her Occupational Therapy degree at Curtin University in a full time capacity whilst continuing to raise two teenage daughters and graduated in 2012. She started her OT career working at the MS Society in a demanding role in Neurodegenerative Conditions Coordinated Care Program (NCCCP), assisting clients with conditions such as MND. This role was extremely challenging in terms of OT skills, dealing with equipment prescription when there is rapidly changing function, as well as the psychosocial demands when working very closely with families at end stages of a client's life. Lynda went on to gain employment with ILC now known as Indigo where she worked in a variety of different areas including complex support coordination and then progressing to Allied Health Manager which at the time of recruitment was a very competitive position. Throughout these challenging and demanding roles, the nominee has volunteered on the WA OT Association committee in the role of newsletter committee representative from 2014 and was appointed to the additional role of Deputy Chairperson in 2021.
